





SUPERINTENDENT REV. BRET ALLEN

Welcome to 2024. Without doubt this will be a year of challenge and celebration. As we embark on 366 fresh days of opportunity, I want to introduce – or re-introduce to you a powerful ministry within our district called Xquisite. Xquisite is directed by Rev. Brenda Sandquist in Carson City, Nevada. Brenda's ministry is to survivors of sex trafficking, sexual assault, and violence. It is my hope that as you learn about this amazing NCN based ministry that you will consider supporting Brenda and her efforts to extend Jesus' love to some very dark corners of our district.



In 2012 Brenda encountered a woman who had several areas where her hair was gone about the size of your fist, and the salon was putting in hair extensions to cover those bald spots. Brenda discovered this was from rough episodes at the local brothel. At that moment God opened her eyes to see these women differently. Nevada's mentality towards these women was unkind and believed they like what they do and get what they deserve. The fact that we have legal prostitution in Nevada only fuels that myth.

As a result of Brenda's willingness to serve, she has been invited to be a voting member of the state's Child Sexual Exploitation Coalition (CSEC), and a voting member of the Nevada Human Trafficking Coalition. She was nominated to, and graduated from, the FBI Citizen Academy.

Brenda opened the doors to the Freedom Center and Drop-In Center in April 2022 and has served 72 new clients within their first year. The center is nearly at capacity, and they are looking to expand in the near future. But they are just getting started as well.

Brenda passionately states:

On behalf of Xquisite, I am always ready to extend our reach into places of influence that will bring awareness and

provide training on how to serve this population who often feel God has abandoned them as a result of what they experience on a daily basis.

It is indeed an honor to be used by God in this capacity and nothing fuels my passion more than to see the spark in a survivor's eye, knowing that someone sees them, hears them, believes them, and loves them right where they are and that their life matters.

Regarding the Xquisite facility, Brenda says:

Our center is nearly at capacity, and we are looking to expand. In the last year and a half since opening our stand-alone Freedom Center we have seen 103 new clients, including 9 male clients. Xquisite also



partners with local Juvenile Probation Services to hold classes in their center 3 times per week, with an average of 15 youth in attendance. This has been an amazing outreach for us to let these youth know that we are here as a resource.

In reference to the future of Xquisite, Brenda states:

I have been asked to be an active part in strategizing with the Nevada Policy Council to begin to bring awareness to human trafficking on the legislative level, in preparation for the next session which begins in 2025. And we continue to work with regional law enforcement agencies and the FBI.

I believe that God presents the vision, and as we look where He leads and we recognize doors that open we walk through them. While we are feeling the need for a larger campus, we have been presented the opportunity to utilize approximately 400 additional square feet in our existing building. We are not waiting for the larger facility to provide needed services; we are expanding now. The expansion will have dedicated space for our nurse practitioner to provide basic medical examinations and trauma informed medical care. It will also provide a place for survivors to rest. The new space will allow survivors to have access to a shower, washer and dryer and personal care items as an addition to the resources we are able to provide now.

It is my hope that in 2024 you will consider supporting Brenda and her efforts to extend Jesus' love in Nevada.

Welcome to 2024!

Every new year brings some changes, and this year we will be changing how we handle the section business meetings. 



Here are some points of discussion to help young people understand what's happening and what to do when He comes.

- 1. When His presence is pronounced in a room, you are not. You may find yourself wanting to get as low as possible. It's okay to bend to your knees and worship in humility. James 4:6
- 2. Some people are overcome with emotion, they may cry, tremble, or even fall down. Trust that your leadership will use discernment to address those who are being disruptive out of wrong motives. Ezekiel 1:28.
- 3. If you need to be healed physically, emotionally, or mentally ask when you sense His presence. Luke 6:19
- 4. You may find yourself wanting to smile or laugh when you sense His presence. It may seem as though the weight of the world has lifted off your shoulders. Psalm 16:11
- 5. Worship in spirit and in truth. Makes sure you use the Word of God as your guideline to whatever you hear and see. Psalm 119:11
- 6. Sometimes people are delivered from strongholds (lies) and demons when His presence is made manifest. Don't be afraid if you hear someone call out or get loud. People crying out can be a sign of pain leaving their body. Not every outward expression is demonic. Again, trust your pastor's discernment and go to them if you have any questions. Casting out demons is the job of every believer. Matthew 10:8
- 7. Just because someone operates in a spiritual gift (prophecy, healing, knowledge) does not mean they are perfect and no longer struggle with sin. Romans 11:29





