### SUPERINTENDENT REV. BRET ALLEN

### **CALLED**

I was 15 years old, president of my youth group and leader of my campus Bible club, when my youth pastor announced the beginning of a new discipleship program. He described it as "intense". I could not wait to sign up. In fact, I offered to hold the "intense" discipleship meetings in my home. I was anxious to participate because I had felt the call of God on my life that year. All I wanted was to know more, experience more, and learn how to do what God was calling me to do. The discipleship group began with several of the people from the youth group. But within weeks the participation began to dwindle due to students not measuring the standards of this "intense" program. Soon I too was eliminated, even though the meetings were held in my home. Before long nobody remained – we had all been eliminated. Each of us suffered a failure in trying to learn discipleship.

In Acts 15:19 (NIV84) it says

"It is my judgment, therefore, that we should not make it difficult for the Gentiles who are turning to God.

James states in this passage – let's not make it hard for people trying to come to God. Let's not make it more difficult than it needs to be. Let's pay attention to the difficulty level as they are seeking God.

While this passage has to do with Gentiles seeking a relationship with God, the principle holds in our discipleship efforts. Discipleship, helping people discover the call of God, and then fulfill that calling, should not be littered with intentional difficulties. Discipleship should include victories – lots of victories. Discipleship done correctly should be hard to fail when you are seeking to fulfill God's call on your life.

On May 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> this year we held our District Council meetings at Trinity Life Center in Sacramento. There were many firsts at this year's Council. First time at Trinity; first time Doree Donaldson spoke at a missions service; and first time Rev. Doug Clay has spoken at our Ordination service. But the most obvious first was the presence of 25 young people wearing red lanyards and "Called" t-shirts attending this year's Council. What a win! Young people identifying the call of God on their lives. A deliberate effort to partner with local church pastors, students, and the District to offer recognition, encouragement, development, and celebration as young people pursue the call of God.

November is just weeks away when the next step in the Called process will take place – the commissioning service at the youth convention. What a day that will be! Young people seeking God's call, each receiving recognition, encouragement, development, and celebration.

I agree with James in Acts 15 – Let's not make it difficult for people who are seeking God. Whether they are seeking His forgiveness, His infilling, or His calling, let's not make it so "intense" that people fail in their efforts.

# CHURCH MINISTRIES REV. CHAR BLAIR

### Sons of Korah . . . workers, warriors and worshippers.

Reading through Psalms 42, 44-49, 84-85, and 87-88 you see the songs are written by the Sons of Korah. Wait . . . is this the same Korah that was rebellious and started a coup against Moses? Yes, that Korah. The Korah who was swallowed alive by an earthquake along with 250 men. Yet, Numbers 26:11 notes, "The sons of Korah, however, did not die."

We know that Korah was the grandson of Kohath, the son of Levi. Levi had three sons, Gershon, Merari and Kohath. All three of the tribes of Levi's sons had a responsibility for carrying the different articles for the tabernacle. Kohath's tribe was responsible for the care of the sanctuary along with the Ark of the Covenant, table, lampstand, and articles used to minister. Gerson and Merari also had responsibilities for carrying objects such as the curtains and the framework for the tabernacle, but they were allowed to place their burdens on carts. The Kohathites were not permitted to use carts but instead they were to carry the items they were responsible for on their shoulders.

Korah found himself getting bitter because of the weight he was under, and he partnered up with others who felt the same way. They were upset because they couldn't use a cart, they were not permitted to touch the goods they were carrying, nor could they see what they were carrying because they had to keep these valuable items covered while they were being transported. Korah thought the rules were unfair and started a rebellion . . . His rights were being violated.

Korah did not understand this principle . . . the more valuable the cargo, the more rules you need to follow and the less rights you have. As pastors you know there are some things you just cannot delegate. Only you carry the weight of certain aspects of ministry on your shoulders. We also know the more valuable the cargo the less rights we have and the more rules there are for handling the precious souls God has placed on our shoulders.

While Korah was swallowed by the earth for his pride and rebellion, his sons however were spared and became doorkeepers and custodians in the tabernacle (workers), they also became expert marksman under King David (warriors) and they were also choral and choir leaders (worshippers).

Maybe you've sung one of their songs like: As the Deer, There is a River, or Dwelling Places. While Korah wanted to replace what God had put in place, his sons became workers, warriors and worshippers. His sons understood that it's not about the level of leadership you attain, but the value of the cargo you carry.

I believe we are seeing the sons of Korah rise up! A generation of those whose fathers and mothers were more interested in climbing ladders, and left a wake of souls under the bus of status. A generation whose mothers and fathers left the church and ministry because of hurt and burnout. This generation is not allured with titles, but they are passionate about pursuing His presence.





### **Vetting Process**

Churches or ministry organizations applying to the Placement Program will be vetted by the NCN District Council based upon 1) the recommendation of the NCN Executive Officers, and 2) the ministry's history of developing staff.


