4. Energy is expended on things that are non-productive.

While he himself went a day's journey into the desert. 1 Kings 19:4

There he went into a cave and spent the night. And the word of the Lord came to him: "What are you doing here, Elijah?"

1 Kings 19:9

5. When time is spent with God – time in God's presence – all focus is on self.

He replied, "I have been very zealous for the Lord God Almighty.

6. In prayer the situation is exaggerated, and other people are placed in negative light. Prayer becomes a complaint session.

He misses provision

He misses the power of God

Session 2

When David and his men came to Ziklag, they found it destroyed by fire and their wives and sons and daughters taken captive 1 Samuel 30:3 (NIV84)

So what does David do? HE ENCOURAGES HIMSELF

1. David walks into a scene where everything that is valuable has been destroyed.

David and his men reached Ziklag on the third day. Now the Amalekites had raided the Negev and Ziklag. They had attacked Ziklag and burned it, and had taken captive the women and all who were in it, both young and old. They killed none of them, but carried them off as they went on their way. 1 Samuel 30:1-2

2. Those who mattered most were gone – taken by the enemy.

When David and his men came to Ziklag, they found it destroyed by fire and their wives and sons and daughters taken captive.

1 Samuel 30:3

3. David and his men wept until they had no more ability to cry

So David and his men wept aloud until they had no strength left to weep. 1 Samuel 30:4

4. His men turn on him and his leadership – they talk of killing him.

David was greatly distressed because the men were talking of stoning him; each one was bitter in spirit because of his sons and daughters. But David found strength in the Lord his God.

How can you encourage <u>yourself?</u>

Let's look at this story again for our example...

So David and his men wept aloud until they had no strength left to weep. 1 Samuel 30:4

1. Allow yourself time to weep

2. Know where to look for help

But David strengthened himself in the Lord his God. 1 Sam 30:6 (NKJV)

I lift up my eyes to the hills — where does my help come from? 2 My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth.
Ps 121:1-2 (NIV84)

3. Put your Focus back on God

Then David said to Abiathar the priest, the son of Ahimelech, "Bring me the ephod." Abiathar brought it to him, 8 and David inquired of the Lord, 1 Sam 30:7-8 (NIV84)

Oh, magnify the Lord with me, And let us exalt His name together. Ps 34:3(NKJV)

Magnify: to enlarge or make bigger in perspective.

When you make God bigger, you make your troubles smaller!

4. Let the Word of God give you direction

So David inquired of the Lord, saying, "Shall I pursue this troop? Shall I overtake them?" And He answered him, "Pursue, for you shall surely overtake them and without fail recover all." So David went, he and the six hundred men who were with him,

So David recovered all that the Amalekites had carried away, and David rescued his two wives. And nothing of theirs was lacking, either small or great, sons or daughters, spoil or anything which they had taken from them; David recovered all. 1 Sam 30:7-9 / 18-19 (NKJV)

Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God." Matt 4:4 (NIV84)

David fought them from dusk until the evening of the next day, and none of them got away, except four hundred young men who rode off on camels and fled. David recovered everything the Amalekites had taken, including his two wives. Nothing was missing: young or old, boy or girl, plunder or anything else they had taken. David brought everything back. He took all the flocks and herds, and his men drove them ahead of the other livestock, saying, "This is David's plunder." 1 Sam 30:17-20 NIV 84

Encouraged leaders cannot be stopped. What / who will impact you around you – simply because you are encouraged?!

Session 3:

Nehemiah 4:7-12 (NKJV)

Now it happened, when Sanballat, Tobiah, the Arabs, the Ammonites, and the Ashdodites heard that the walls of Jerusalem were being restored and the gaps were beginning to be closed, that they became very angry, and all of them conspired together to come and attack Jerusalem and create confusion.

Nevertheless we made our prayer to our God, and because of them we set a

These four things are the causes of discouragement.

1. FATIGUE

4. FEAR

THE CURES FOR DISCOURAGEMENT

Restore your <u>body</u>

It is vain for you to rise up early, To sit up late, To eat the bread of sorrows; For so He gives His beloved sleep. Psalm 127:2 (NKJV)

Reorganize your <u>life</u>

Therefore I positioned men behind the lower parts of the wall, at the openings; and I set the people according to their families, with their swords, their spears, and their bows. Nehemiah 4:13 (NKJV)

Remember the Lord

And I looked, and arose and said to the nobles, to the leaders, and to the rest of the people, "Do not be afraid of them. Remember the Lord, great and awesome, and fight for your brethren, your sons, your daughters, your wives, and your houses." Nehemiah 4:14 (NKJV)

Remember three things about the Lord

- 1. His goodness in the past.
- 2. Remember Gods presence in the present time.
- 3. Remember his power will help in the future.

Resist Discouragement
